INTRODUCTION

Turkana County continues to face a mountain of challenges, despite efforts to counter poverty in the region caused by persistent drought sparing no part of the county. The healthcare system in Turkana County confronts significant obstacles that impede the provision of quality care.

One major issue is the insufficient physical infrastructure common in developing areas. This leads to poorly equipped hospitals due to limited funding and resources. Socioeconomic barriers, including poverty and lack of education, further impact healthcare utilization—necessitating targeted interventions such as poverty alleviation programs and culturally sensitive healthcare initiatives.

These socioeconomic factors contribute to poor health outcomes in Turkana County. Poverty leads to malnutrition and inadequate access to clean water and sanitation, exacerbating health-related issues. Moreover, inadequate infrastructure, unreliable electricity, and scarcity of medical equipment hinder the efficient delivery of healthcare services, affecting the quality of care provided to residents.

Despite these challenges, our impactful work in the field has remained active and brought hope to those in our operational areas.

The gratitude expressed by the community for our partnership with SERV International, coming to their rescue in times of crisis, is palpable. This reminds us of the profound impact our work can have on individuals and communities in difficult times.

The primary obstacle to healthcare in Turkana is access, largely influenced by the county's vast and challenging landscape, as well as the traditional way of life followed by tribes. The nomadic lifestyle is coupled with deeply rooted, centuries-old beliefs that often prioritize traditional healing methods over modern medical practices. These include medicine men, seers, and untrained birth attendants.

However, despite these traditional beliefs, there is growing recognition of the need for modern medicine as many individuals in these communities are currently in need of medical care. The most significant challenge faced in providing healthcare to these communities is the limited access to medical services. Most areas we visit are remote, characterized by rough terrain and lack of medical facilities. However, once we reach these villages, we become their lifeline and offer much-needed medical assistance.

We are sincerely grateful for the partnership between Isagenix and SERV International that has enabled the smooth running of these operations.

From June 22nd to June 26th, the House of Hope welcomed 10 new rescued children from various villages across Turkana County. Each child arrived with a unique story of hardship and hope, and they were overjoyed to join their new brothers and sisters. We're delighted to report that all of them are thriving in their new environment. Upon arrival, they underwent comprehensive medical check-ups, which confirmed they are in good health. The children have now started their playgroup classes and are thoroughly enjoying themselves. Currently, they are learning Swahili to help them communicate more effectively with others at the House of Hope. It's heartwarming to see their progress, and we're excited about their potential as they settle into their new home. We can't wait to witness the amazing things these children will achieve and become during their time at the House of Hope. Their resilience and enthusiasm are truly inspiring.

We are so proud to announce the growth of our House of Hope family. During the Kenyan Mission trip, our team was able to rescue 10 new precious children from different villages in Turkana and bring them to their new home. Each child has their own tragic story and the most heartbreaking one is about Kiyoga Mogila. Kiyoga was born on June 4th, 2020 and is the 2nd born child in his family. His mother suffers from mental illness and his father is unknown. A week before his rescue, Kiyoga's mum had killed her one year old son and was chasing after Kiyoga to do the same. Luckily for him family friends stepped in and immediately informed the director of the House of Hope, Moses Lorukudi. As tragic as that story is, we are so grateful that Isagenix and SERV International were able to step in and Kiyoga's story will never be the same. He is now surrounded by so much love and care and will be able to grow in such a safe and healthy environment with good education.

Meet Esther Akuwom, a 76-year-old woman from Namorunyang village in Turkana. Esther tragically lost her husband in April during the floods; he was swept away while sleeping outside one night and was found the following day. Heartbroken and unable to take care of herself, she moved in with her eldest daughter and her family. Esther attended one of our medical camps with her daughter's help, where she was diagnosed with malaria and pneumonia. We provided her with immediate medical care and food support, ensuring she now receives a steady supply of SERV Food to sustain herself and her daughter. The medication has been effective thanks to the nutritious meals she has been consuming. Esther is grateful to Isagenix and SERV International for helping her through this difficult time in her life.
